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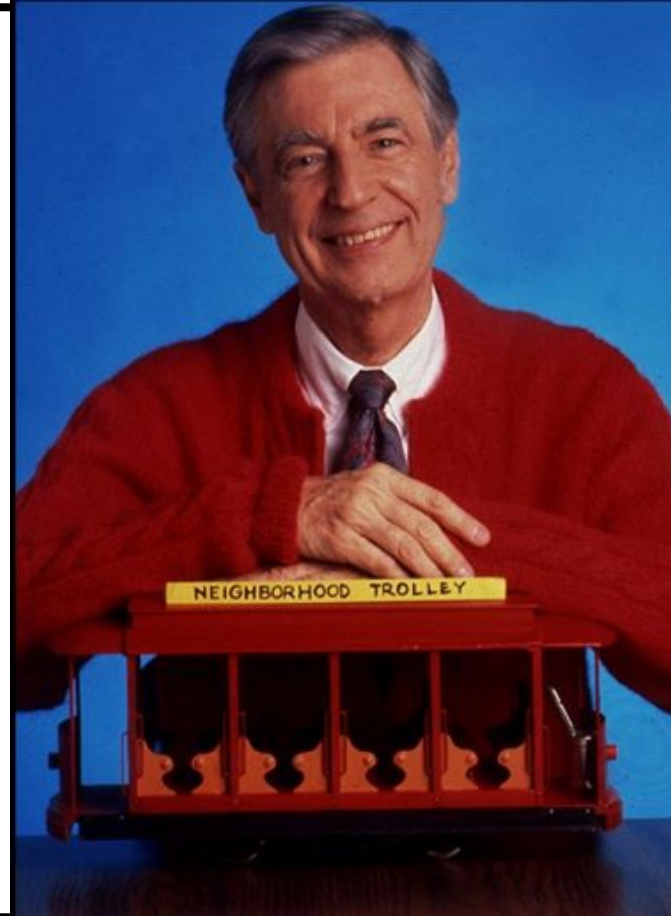

Lawrenceville Corporation

- History: Formed in January 2000 as a merger of the Lawrenceville Development Corporation (LDC) and the Lawrenceville Business Association (LBA).
 - Initial focus on blight in the neighborhood, development, artists and creatives (16.62 Design Zone)
 - Mission: Driven by the Lawrenceville community, the Lawrenceville Corporation acts as the catalyst and conduit for responsible and sustainable growth.
 - Board: Mostly comprised of residents, property owners, and business owners and elected by our membership
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Lawrenceville United

- Mission: to improve and protect quality of life for all Lawrenceville residents
- Membership of over 950 residents
- Board comprised of all residents: elected by our membership
- Programs: Lawrenceville Farmers Market, supporting older adults, free food distributions, cleaning & greening, direct support & case management, advocacy, and more.



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The Capital Budget

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What is the capital budget?

- How the City's mayor prioritizes and funds desired large-scale projects for the calendar year
 - Includes projects like:
 - Arsenal and Leslie Park
 - Major upgrades to our streets and sidewalks
 - Creation of a dog park
 - Etc.



What is in the 2026 budget for Lawrenceville?

Arsenal Park

- No new funding for 2026, but funding will be available for 2027
 - 2027: \$4.5 million for Phase 2 construction
 - Includes basketball courts, updates to pond
 - 2028: \$400 thousand for Phase 3 design
 - 2029: \$5 million for Phase 3 construction

What is in the 2026 budget for Lawrenceville?

Leslie Park

- No new funding for 2026, but \$2.5 million is scheduled for construction in 2027

Allegheny River Green Boulevard

- \$3,920,000 in Federal Highway grants and local match budgeted for 2026-2028

What is in the 2026 budget for Lawrenceville?

City-wide Projects (that could include Lawrenceville projects)

- Paving/Street Resurfacing
 - Ramp and Public Sidewalk
 - None currently planned for Lawrenceville in 2026
 - Neighborhood Traffic Calming

Lawrenceville Mobility Enhancement District (MED)

- Dynamic parking hours and pricing
 - Improve curb management while creating a new funding stream for neighborhood improvements
- Implementation began November 2024
- Revenue as of August 2025 - \$119,115.20
 - Projected ~\$164,000 by end of year

Project Selection Process

- Community Meeting and Survey – July 2025
- DOMI drafts project ideas based on community priorities
- Project Proposals shared with community for final selection
- Budget is submitted to Council by December 1

Goals for Year One

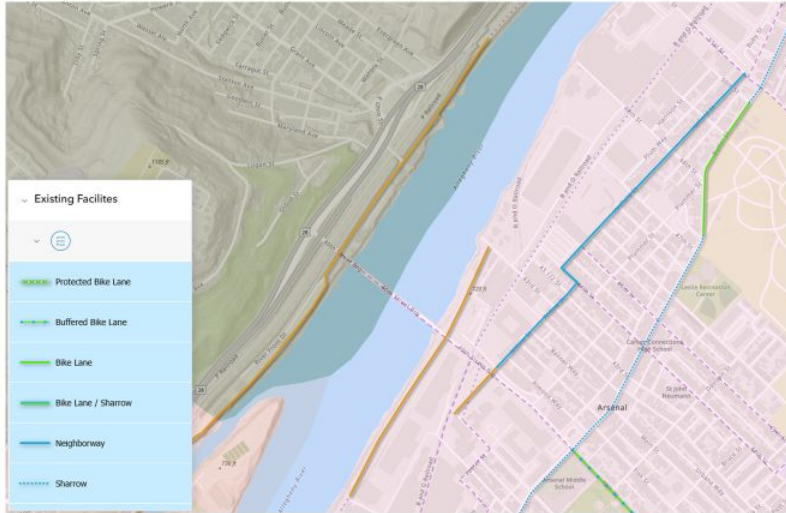
- Significant traffic safety improvement
 - Visible location
 - Implementable in one year
 - Within budget
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- Proposals can be scaled to use as much funding as desired – can complete one of the four options, or a combination of all of them

40th and Davison Improvements



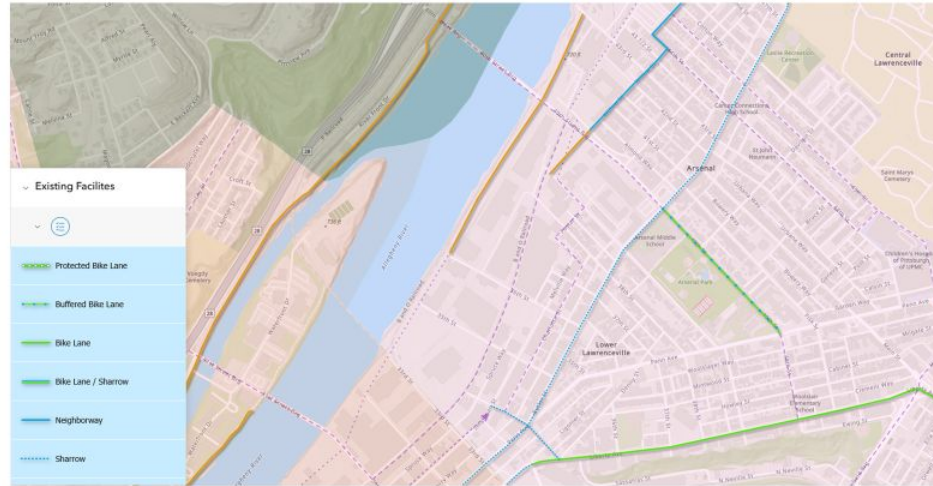
- Paint/flex post splitter island at Davison can be upgraded to a concrete design
- The climbing bike lane can be protected by concrete curbs or flex posts
- Add parking lane line to denote the edge of the parking lane and help to dissuade sidewalk parking

Lawrenceville Neighborway Upgrade



- Upgrade existing painted bump outs to concrete (up to 6 corners)
- Add crosswalks to intersections
- Add wayfinding, especially around the new 40th St Bridge underpass

Lawrenceville Neighborway Extension



- Extend existing neighborway treatment west towards the Strip
- Add painted extensions, flex posts, crosswalks
- Add wayfinding signage and pavement markings

Curb Ramp Improvements



- Assess curb ramp conditions neighborhood-wide to determine high need locations
- Replace up to 24 curb ramps across Lawrenceville

Butler St Crosswalk Improvements



- Add pavement markings to existing crossings that are not marked
- Intensive Butler St improvements require more time due to PennDOT coordination
